

End of Course Exams

The End of Course Exam is a state required exam for core-classes to serve as a final exam. The EOC is a diagnostic exam to test students to identify students' strengths and areas of weaknesses. These exams are also used to evaluate effectiveness of classrooms and instruction. Mathematics, social studies, science, and English language arts EOCs have been created for evaluation.

Some Colquitt County High School students will be required to take an EOC in the spring to count as a final exam. The courses required to take these exams are 9th Grade Literature, American Literature, Biology, Physical Science, U.S. History, Economics, Analytic Geometry, and Math I and II.

Teachers may already be discussing EOC exams and preparations with their classes. If not, speak to them for preparation purposes! Students do not wait until the week of these exams to prepare. Begin to review NOW!
