## Essay Contests

Junior and senior high school students are eligible to compete for two scholarships in January and February. The Better Business Bureau's Students of Integrity essay contest is a 500-750 word essay focused on ethical decisions regarding work, family, school, or community. The BBB's essay contest winners will win a \$500 scholarship for books, school supplies, dorm supplies, and other college expenses.

The Atlantic and College Board Writing Prize essay contest is a 1,000 to 2,000 word essay that focuses on analyzing a selected document's historical and/or cultural context and connects it to personal experiences. The winner of The Atlantic and College Board Writing Prize essay contest can win up to \$5,000 with their winning entry published in The Atlantic. Six finalists will be awarded \$2,500.

If a man hasn't registered by the age of 26 but has been in the U.S. before this age, he can be prosecuted and fined up to \$250,000 with five years in prison, and he is no longer eligible for student financial aid, U.S. Citizenship, Federal Job Training, or Federal Jobs. Georgia penalties also include not meeting student financial aid requirements, but you must also register for Selective Services in order to have state employment and a state driver's license.

Luckily, registering isn't difficult. You can register at <u>http://www.sss.gov/</u>, you can pick up the registration forms at the U.S. Post Office, or you can check the "Register Me" Box #22 on the application for the Federal Student Financial Aid (FAFSA form).

Men are obligated to register at 18 because of the Military Selective Service Act, so don't wait until the last minute. Go ahead and register today! The Colquitt County High School FBLA Club is selling posters of Mack Tharpe Stadium/Tom White Field.

## Looking for Scholarships?

When you are planning to go to college, things can be financially difficult. Maybe what can benefit you are the blessings of a scholarship. One of the many scholarships offered and one of the most popular is the HOPE scholarship. To be awarded with the HOPE scholarship, a student has to graduate with at least a grade point average of 3.0 from an eligible high school.

A student must be enrolled as a degree-seeking student at a public or private high school. The school has to be HOPE eligible for a college or university in Georgia. There are state program requirements, too. The student has to be a U.S citizen or has to be eligible for non-citizen requirements. The student has to be a Georgia legal resident, and be registered with Selective Service. Students have to meet satisfactory academic progress and not be in default or owe a refund from a student financial program.

There are many more scholarships offered here at our school. Make sure you spend a little time checking them out and see which ones could help you achieve more success in your career after high school.
